### From the Principal

A study was done once on 100 people deemed to be successful and content to see if it could be discovered scientifically the secret of happiness. They were asked many questions, and their answers were explored to see what the common features of all of these people were. And while there were some similarities here and there (like 70% had come from small towns), there was nothing obvious that connected them all. Until it was discovered.

They were all "goodfinders." That is, they all had the ability to find the good in themselves, in others, and in all the situations of life.

Too often we look for happiness in life externally. We look to other people or things to make us happy. We think that if we buy that product, or own that possession, we will be

happy. We think that if that person treats me the right way, or if my football team wins, we will be happy. But of course the danger of looking to external things to be happy is that we will always depend upon others for our happiness, and then we subcontract out our happiness to others.

However, if we look for the good in ourselves and others, we are far more likely to find happiness in our lives. Too often we compare ourselves to others and find ourselves coming up short. We notice other people's gifts and talents and are disappointed we aren't as good as them at one thing or another. But in doing so, we fail to recognize our own gifts and talents and the things that make us unique.

Similarly, we often judge others upon their weaknesses, rather than their strengths. I have

seen quite amazing children judged by others upon their appearance or lack of social skills or mannerisms, and for people to completely miss what makes them such special children. Again, if this is how we go about our lives, judging others on their weaknesses, we will forever have a deficit mindset and lose any chance to be truly happy ourselves.

At Star of the Sea it is important for us to provide children with the opportunities to see the good in themselves, in others, and in life's situations.

If we are truly to produce a generation of responsible and compassionate citizens, then we must create a school of "goodfinders."

National Families Week  
15 - 21 May

National Families Week in Australia begins on the 15<sup>th</sup> May. It is a time to celebrate with family, make contact with extended family members and friends and share in the enjoyment of family. It is an opportunity to celebrate family and make the most of family life. Families are societies most important building block because it is in the family that we learn to care for others and develop a sense of connectedness.

Pope Francis provides many insights into family life. He says that "please", "thank you" and "sorry", are words that "open up the road to a good family life". The Pope described them as simple but not so easy to put into practice. These three words we normally understand as good manners. The first word, "the Pope said" is please. When we take the effort to kindly ask for something that maybe we think is our due, we are really safeguarding the spirit of family life. That language that is polite but full of love, does so much good for families".

"The second word is 'thanks'. Kindness and the ability to thank can be seen as a sign of weakness, but gratitude is the very heart of faith: a Christian who does not know how to give thanks is one who has forgotten the language of God."

"The third word is 'sorry'. It is a difficult word, certainly, yet so necessary. Recognition of having erred, and willingness to give back what has been taken away - respect, honesty, love – makes us worthy of forgiveness. If we are unable to apologize, it means that we are unable to forgive. Never end the day in the family without making peace. Do you understand this? It is not easy, eh! But you have to do it. And with that life will be more beautiful."

"These three key words of the family are simple words, and perhaps at first make us smile. But when we forget them, there's nothing to laugh about, right? Our manners, perhaps, we neglect them too much. May the Lord help us to put them back to the right place, in our hearts and in our homes. "


### **The Production Team Needs Your Help!**
