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### From the Principal

I recently read an news article which started off by talking about how much screen time children should have and how much time outside they should have (*screen time vs green time*). It suggested that more outside time was better for mental health, but also that computer games help children stay in touch with peers and games could also help with cognitive function and coordination.

However the most interesting piece of research came later on in the article. It has been found that there is a positive correlation between mental health outcomes in children and adolescents, and the amount of autonomy they have to roam outside unsupervised. In other words, the more independence we give to our children to roam outside without our supervision, the better their mental health.

This really struck me as we live in a society today where many of us are reluctant to give our children the independence to do this. It would seem that over the years we have kept our children

inside, or to the confines of our backyard, more and more. We often hear stories from our grandparents about the amount of time they spent outside unsupervised. The article suggested that in some countries around the world, more freedom is given to children to be outside, simply because the community takes on a joint responsibility of looking after the children. If one of the children does the wrong thing or needs help the community steps in, not just the parents of the child.

In the spiritual writer Margaret Silf's book, *Roots and Wings*, she refers to the quote by Holding Carter, that "wise parents give their children just two gifts - roots and wings." Roots from the point of view that children need a sense of belonging and a certain knowledge that, no matter what happens, they are rooted in their parent's love. But children also need wings in that they need to be set free to live and discover and shape their own unique story.

As far as a school goes, we should be doing the same. We aim to give our students that sense of belonging and the knowledge that someone is looking out for them. But we also need to provide them with the freedom to try things out, to get things wrong, to shape their own unique lives without us saying what they should or shouldn't become. We need to give our students that independence "to roam unsupervised," that is, to find out answers for themselves without the adults feeding them the answers all of the time.

In the Star of the Sea Catholic community, we realise that things will go wrong in our children's lives. There will be times when they feel uncomfortable. But the times when we are uncomfortable are the times when we are learning the most. We don't actually learn by feeling comfortable all of the time. So we should look for ways to encourage independence and uncomfortableness in our children.
