## From the Principal

Do we go looking for the joy that students, and our own children, bring us?

On the weekend a comment was made to me by a member of the community that I must get a lot of joy from seeing new, young students come into the school. He was speaking about the idea of the life and energy they have at that age, with the whole life to look forward to. I joked to him that students don't always bring us joy, sometimes they can be hard work! But his point got me thinking - do we go looking for the joy that students, and our own children, bring us?

Newborns often bring us a lot of joy with their cuteness and their innocence. But they also can bring us lots of worry and sleepless nights with feeding and changing nappies.

Toddlers often bring us joy as they learn about the world in such an energetic way. But they can also bring us frustration with their tantrums.

Children can bring us joy as they grow and learn and we start to recognise their own unique personalities. But they can also bring us worry when we feel they aren't learning or developing as we want.

Teenagers can bring us joy as we look at them in wonder as they become young adults and as they gradually show their maturity. But they can also bring us annoyance when they act a bit too...teenagerish.

But the point is, when we stop and reflect on the development of our children, the joy can be in the worry and the frustration and the annoyance. Because the frustration and worry and annoyance is only there because we love our children. If that love wasn't there, neither would be the other emotions we feel. So the joy comes in recognizing how much we truly love our children.

So do I get joy from students at our school? Of course I do. Whether it be Kinder students who are still at the point of using their imagination for play, or teenagers

who start to show their potential and start building in confidence, each and every student gives us reason for joy each day if we bother to look for it.

In our Star of the Sea Catholic community, finding joy is important for us if we are truly to become who God calls us to be. Because God calls us to be people who recognize each other as human beings and, in doing so, recognize what joy each human being can bring to the world.


## Religious Education and Faith Development >

This quote from the Acts of the Apostles, chosen by Pope Francis, has been chosen for this year's theme for World Mission Day 2021. #### In the Event of a Lockdown...

Last Friday's decision by the State Government to put Hobart into lockdown is a reminder to us all as to how fast things can change. A reminder to parents and carers that, should we go into lockdown and students are required to learn from home, our main method of communication about schoolwork will be through Compass. #### **Sunsmart Policy**

This week teachers will be monitoring students in the yard and if they are not wearing a wide brimmed hat they will be asked to sit in the shade. Please note that caps, unless they are a legionnaires' hat, are not suitable for wearing when outside at school, and students with caps will also be asked to sit in the shade. Each of the primary classrooms have sunscreen available in them for the students to use. If your child has any allergies to sunscreen can you please let their classroom teacher be aware of this. Secondary students are not required to wear a hat when in the yard, however they are encouraged to do so. Sunscreen is also available for them at the school office.

#### **Inappropriate Online and Television Content**

It's not uncommon for students to share with their peers at school some of the things that they watch on TV and when scrolling the internet watching the vast variety of videos that are available. Often students come across content that may not be appropriate for their viewing. No doubt during the holidays many students, including primary aged students, were given opportunities to browse online content and streaming services such as Netflix. It is important for parents and carers to ensure that parental controls are in place to protect their children from viewing inappropriate content. Some of the content that students can access is definitely not suitable for their age. It is also important for parents to monitor their students' internet usage. The current guidelines suggest that children aged between 5 and 17 should be only accessing screen time for recreational purposes no longer than 2 hours per day. Sometimes parents and carers may be unaware if a particular program is or isn't appropriate. Parents and carers are always invited to catch up with a staff member and ask the question, "My child has been watching .... and I don't know if that's appropriate or not. Do you know about this show?"
