They can get it directly from the source.

At last Thursday's Secondary Assembly, the students were asked to reflect upon the character strength of hope. People who have hope are realistic and also full of optimism about the future. They believe in their actions and feel confident things will turn out well. In life, we can sometimes feel powerless to change a situation and therefore lose hope. For some, the war in Ukraine has sapped away their hope, as they feel powerless to do anything about it. For others it might be floods or fires which have affected them or people they know. Or it could be hearing about a loved one who only has a short time to live.

But while some people can lose their hope in these situations, others are still able to hang onto hope. It is usually these people who have hope as one of their character strengths. Where they get their hope from is difficult to know, but for Christians, our hope comes through the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

It is timely that we talk about hope at this time of year. When Jesus died on the cross around 2000 years ago, his followers lost hope. Many ran away. But his rising from the dead just a few days later was the ultimate "hope-booster." All of a sudden everyone who was pessimistic about the future, everyone who thought God had abandoned them, everyone who thought their actions would not change anything, had an injection of hope. Jesus' resurrection tells us that, no matter how dark things seem, no matter how dreary the future looks, it's okay. God's got it under control.

Often we don't see God's hand at work in the world around us. We see misery and suffering, war and misfortune. But we are called to look closer. We are called to look at the loving actions of those around us. We are called to see the way people look after each other, support each other and are kind to each other. Because when we see these things we see God working in the world and we know that we can be hopeful about the future.



Our school's Vision statement talks about us looking forward to the future as "people of hope." Sometimes we can look at what is happening in our lives here and now and lose hope. But now is not our future. We have control over how we want our future to turn out. We write the book of our lives, and because of this we can write a book of hope.

In our Star of the Sea Catholic community we need to keep reminding our students that there is hope in the future, not only through the words we speak but through the example of our actions.


