From the Principal

What makes schools successful? If you asked many different schools they would probably say many different things!

Some may say their school is successful because they have amazing academic results. While good results are good to have, it means that schools who serve students who have intellectual disabilities will never be successful!

Some may say their school is successful because they are full. But there are plenty of schools around Australia that are bursting at the seams, mainly because they are in areas with high population growth.

Some may say their school is successful because they win stuff. That is problematic, though, because it means we use students for the image of the school, instead of serving students.

Perhaps the true measure of success of a Catholic school is how kind the people in it are - staff and students. Along with this, perhaps we could say a measure of success is how well people feel they belong. How much they feel like the school they go to values them, and how much they feel they can be successful at that school.

Because if the Easter story reminds us of anything as Catholic schools, it reminds us of Jesus' desire for us to be fully human and fully alive. And it is only through the way we treat others with kindness can we hope to achieve that.

So how is Star of the Sea going? If we measure our success on kindness and a sense of belonging, are we successful?

Like most things in life, we never quite achieve things 100% of the time. Our students aren't always kind to each other, but they are also children who are learning how to be kind. Our staff are just like any other adults in society where tiredness and stress can lead us to say the wrong thing at the wrong time, and as functioning adults we need to always reflect on those times and make amends. Whilst we strive to be kind, none of us are perfect!

But we take heart when we hear of the school being a welcoming place, when relief staff come in and say how nice the students are and how the staff make them welcome. We take heart when students look after each other and make sure each other is okay. And we take heart when students and staff walk into the school each morning with a smile as they know it is a safe place where they feel they belong. (The smiles aren't always there at the end of the day, but that's what you get from a day of learning!)

If we are going to strive to be successful as a Catholic school, and keep the spirit of Jesus in our hearts, we must strive to be kind. Then we will be who called calls us to be.



Deputy Principal's Message

With the commencement of Easter, followed by the end of term holiday break it is timely to reflect on the many opportunities our students have had to celebrate their strengths and areas of growth. It also provides an opportunity for each person to consider areas for future improvement and growth. In the secondary school, we have been considering people's character strengths and ways we can foster greater development of these. In assemblies, staff and students have prepared information and positive examples of character strengths being used in everyday lives. Each student will have the opportunity to investigate their own character strengths and to develop greater understanding about the ways they can continue to build upon their strength of character.

The character strengths evident in Jesus are present in many of our students. The fruit of the Spirit is love, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. (Galatians 5:22-23) Jesus was all of these things and a great deal more and provided a model of human character that we hope to foster in each person.

Our focus on human character strengths occurs in many areas of the school and I encourage you to engage in conversations with your children about the strengths you see in them, as this helps to highlight these virtues and affirm the goodness within each person. Although we have not introduced the same vocabulary with primary students at this stage, we certainly promote the same values and strengths through recognition and affirmation. The Shout Outs listed in the newsletter and displayed in the Primary Gallery highlight the many qualities and strengths of our primary students, as do the Star of the Week awards.



George Town Book Fairies




The George Town Book Fairies hope to start a new craze in George Town. The newly appointed fairies want to hide books in and around town for the local kids to find. Kids will find a book sealed in a plastic sleeve, take it home to read, write their name in the book, and then re-hide it or pass it on to a friend.

The books will be hidden in shop windows, parks, and streets, in and around George Town. The concept is simple and follows the global painted rocks craze, where kids hunt for painted rocks around their local neighbourhood. The Book Fairies will distribute new and gently used books to the kids of George Town via the hidden book craze, hoping to impact literacy rates directly.
