From the Principal

Last week at assembly our Year 9s spoke about the character strength of *social intelligence*. This is the strength that some people have when they know what makes other people tick. They are aware of the motives and feelings of themselves and others.

The thing about social intelligence being a character strength, is that it is just that - a strength that some people have, while others do not. Every day at Star of the Sea we work with students who have it as a strength and work with students for who it is a weakness. And if we were to consider what leads to behaviour problems with students at any school, a lot of the time it can be put down to a lack of social intelligence. In the end, some students just don't know how others tick and say or do the wrong things and upset people.

We might have this idea that children who lack social intelligence are quiet and don't say much. But I have equally experienced very outgoing people who had a similar lack of social intelligence. They were more than happy to talk to others, but most of the time what they said to them was offensive or inappropriate.

When we view social intelligence as a strength, rather than just something everyone should have, we can start to look at children in a different way. Rather than calling them rude, we might be better off recognising that they don't have the social intelligence to make the appropriate comments at the appropriate time.

Interestingly enough, social intelligence is probably the one strength that everyone wants their child to have! Parents can feel embarrassed when their child does not do or say the right thing in a certain situation, while sometimes others are quick to look down on children who do not display social intelligence.

So what do we do when a child does not have social intelligence?

The first thing is to have *a lot* of patience. Many children who lack social intelligence improve with age, and by being put in different situations, like school! Secondly, we sometimes need to be prepared to teach children what to say or do in certain situations so that they can start to strengthen their social skills. We can't assume all children will just "work it out."

In our Star of the Sea Catholic community we welcome students with strengths in many different areas, but equally we welcome students who have weaknesses in all different areas. Together as a community we look to grow as human beings and become who God calls us to be.

#5 Tell an adult if you receive a mean or strange message from someone
