From the Principal

You can't achieve what you can't imagine.

This may sound like a pretty obvious statement, but lack of imagination is something which holds many people back. People are caught in a cycle of repeating the same errors time and again, not because they want to, but because they can't see themselves doing anything else.

We have seen this lack of imagination recently in the Middle East, with yet another conflict between Israel and Hamas. If either or both sides could imagine what peace could look like, or imagine a pathway to it, then perhaps we wouldn't see the continual cycle of violence. Instead the imagination only extends as far as words like "security" and "freedom." And there is a great reluctance to change from the narrative that both sides have created about themselves and about each other, so the cycle of violence goes on.

Great leadership usually requires great imagination. When we look back in recent history, there have been very few times that people had the imagination to take a different path. People and events that come to mind are Nelson Mandela in South Africa in the 1990s; the Good Friday Agreement in the 1990s which saw an end to the cycle of violence in Northern Ireland; and the idea of *glasnost* and *perestroika* which opened up the Soviet Union in the 1980s.

But in order to be able to achieve anything we need to imagine ourselves doing it. Many of us might think we would be able to play the guitar if we took lessons, because we have seen other people play it. However, few of us would think we could play the zither, especially if we have never heard of it and never seen it played!

The same goes for how we interact with others. Sometimes young people haven't yet developed the imagination to see themselves interacting with everyone in a positive way. Instead, they create a narrative that some people are my friends, and others are not, and for those that are not I don't have to treat them respectfully. While most grow out of this as they get older, we still see some adults behave in this way. They, too, don't have the imagination to interact positively with everyone.

So in our Star of the Sea Catholic community it is important for us to engage in a wide range of experiences, and to expose our children to a wide range of experiences. In order to build their imagination, children need to see how things can be done

differently. They need to see plenty of examples of adults living peacefully, of interacting with each other positively, and of things being done differently. God calls us to live in peace, but we have to have the imagination to get there.

When there are new or renewed conflicts in the world, our television screens, news programs and online content can be flooded with images and information that brings a perspective of those conflicts into our homes and into our lives.
