From the Principal

I recently came across a quote that suggested "Grandparents have silver in their hair and gold in their hearts." At last week's Grandparents Day prayer I asked the students what they thought it meant to have "silver in your hair." One said it was a sign of wisdom (which received big nods of agreement from nearby, grey-haired adults) but also said that having silver in your hair meant that you had grey hair.

I then asked what it meant to have "gold in your heart." We sometimes use the expression that a person has a heart of gold. And without hesitation one student put their hand up and said that people who have gold in their heart are kind and generous and caring.

We often take people and things for granted in our life, and we need to stop every once in a while and truly give thanks for our lives. At the moment I am currently giving thanks each day that I live in Tasmania rather than the Middle East. But we also need to stop and give thanks for the people who support us as parents, and more often than not it is grandparents who do that.

Many times it is grandparents who step in when parenting becomes tough. Sometimes it is tough because of the amount of time we have, and we ask our grandparents to step in and look after our children for a while. But sometimes it is tough because relationships between parents can break down, and grandparents are able to step in and support their grandchildren through these difficult times. And for that, we give thanks.

In the Catholic tradition, we are also able to give thanks for our grandparents, even if they have died. Through our prayers we can be grateful for all that they did during their lives.

Just like silver and gold, grandparents are precious. If I was to walk into a jewellery store and ask for something made of pure silver or pure gold, I could expect to pay a little bit more for it (or a lot more). The idea of having silver in our hair and gold in our hearts also tells us something about how precious our grandparents are and how important it is to care for them. Last week our Year 9s visited Ainslie, where many grandparents now live, and gave them gifts to

honour and thank them for being the

precious people that they are.

In our Star of the Sea Catholic community it is important to stop and give thanks for those people who shape our lives for the better, and to let them know just how precious they are.

Sacrament Program

Star of the Sea will be offering a Sacrament Program in conjunction with the local parish for students who are interested. The seven sacraments of the Church include three sacraments of initiation, Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist, two sacraments of healing Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick and two sacraments of service and mission, Marriage and Holy Orders.

Students who are interested in learning more about their own faith journey and the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and First Communion (Eucharist), including Reconciliation are welcome to pass on their name to Mrs Davis or Mrs Robotham. Whilst a person can be baptised at any age (providing they have not previously been baptised), the sacraments of Confirmation, Reconciliation and First Communion are usually received in the upper primary years, or at a later age. The program will commence in Term One, 2024.
