## From the Principal

One of the more unfortunate proverbs we come across is “Curiosity killed the cat.” The meaning of it is that we should not be looking into other people’s affairs, but unfortunately it has been used so much that we now think we shouldn’t be curious at all! That is unfortunate, as curiosity is an extremely important tool that each of us need.

In our secondary assembly last week, the students spoke about *curiosity* as a character strength. To be curious is to explore and discover and to take an interest in our life experience. It is not being nosy and trying to find things we can gossip about, but instead it is being fully engaged with life itself.

When difficult situations arise it is often due to us not knowing what will happen next. We get worried or anxious because we create stories about what could happen, rather than waiting to see what does happen. This is when curiosity becomes important. Rather than worrying about the future, we can be curious about it. Rather than saying, “Oh no! This is going to be terrible!” we can instead say, “This is interesting. I wonder what will happen next.”


By being curious we place ourselves in the present moment, rather than thinking about what will happen in the future, which we can never predict anyway.

At the assembly I challenged the students that, between now and the end of the year, when they wake up in the morning, rather than moan and groan about having to go to school or what bad things may happen, to instead make sure the first thing they think is, “I wonder what will happen today.” If this becomes a habit over time, we will be able to face life in a much more positive way.

Because the reality is, there is nothing that will happen that we can’t handle together. Even if bad things do happen, we can usually band together and get through it. Tasmania is in a fortunate part of the world in that it is very unlikely we will be invaded in the future, or that an asteroid will slam into us, or that there will be great unrest on the streets. So assuming none of these things happen, everything else that happens can usually be handled.

If God didn’t want us to be interested in the world, He probably would not have created us! Being interested about the world and our life experience is what has led to many of the great developments over the years. In our Star of the Sea Catholic community, let’s continue to be interested, continue to be curious, continue to seek the truth regarding who God is calling us to be.

Our Presentation Feats Day will occur next Friday 24th November. More information is included in this newsletter. Parents and families are most welcome to join us for the Mass.

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
