## From the Principal

Robert Frost wrote a famous poem called The Road Not Taken, made famous by the lines:

Two roads diverged in a wood, and I -I took the one less travelled by, And that has made all the difference.

I was reminded of this recently while travelling along the West Tamar Highway for the sake of a university assignment, and I pulled in and out of small towns along the river, taking photos, getting my shoes stuck in the Tamar mud, and trying not to get sunburnt.

I drove on roads I had not been along before. I saw all of the jetties in Rosevears where the gates were padlocked and the jetties were marked as "Private," as people tried to bring some sense of certainty to their lives. I looked over Brady's Lookout and wondered if, in 100 years time, those convicted of stealing today would have places named after them. And I met a guy trying to keep invasive fish species out of the Tamar.

Travelling to different places can open our eyes and our minds as we experience different things. But not everyone has the chance to do it. I'm often surprised when I speak to people who have lived in Tasmania all of their lives but have never been to the West Coast. Others I meet have never left Tasmania. But travel can sometimes be a privileged thing. People who survive on little money or who have poor health are often not in the position where they can take holidays out of their hometown. That goes equally for people living on the mainland as it does for Tasmanians.

But taking the "road less travelled" doesn't always have to be a journey somewhere. We can choose the road less travelled with our lives and how we spend them. Nano Nagle, in making the decision to serve the poor and needy of Cork, in Ireland, certainly took the road less travelled. This is especially so given that she did have the choice at one point to live a life of luxury, or to become a cloistered nun.

As our Year 10s finish in the next two weeks, they have to make decisions about what road they should take. Just like Robert Frost in his poem, they don't really know where the paths they choose will take them. But sometimes the road that everyone else has taken is not as interesting, or may not suit individuals. In these cases, the road less travelled may be exactly what they need.

God doesn't always call us to "play it safe." Playing it safe doesn't always lead to growth. If we are going to follow God then we, too, may just need to be prepared to take that road less travelled.

The Church's season of Advent is almost upon us, a beautiful season which marks the four weeks of preparation before Christmas. The word 'Advent' means 'coming' or 'arrival' and is the period where we once again prepare our hearts and minds for the birth of Jesus, the Messiah.



The focus of this season is the Advent Wreath, which is a symbol of our journey to Christmas. The wreath features four candles (three purple and one pink) to be lit on each of the Sundays of Advent. The candles represent the feelings associated with this time of waiting. The first candle (to be lit on the 3 December) symbolises hope.
