# From the Principal

On Saturday I helped out with the LUFT Run Fundraiser, doing different things at different times of the day. Whilst reflecting on the day later, two things in particular struck me - what students are capable of, and what people can achieve in the right environment.

As far as the first reflection goes, Saturday's event was a great example of what students are capable of given the right support. The day itself was predominantly organised and run by the Year 9 and 10 leaders, and through the experience they learnt a lot about what running a big event consisted of. It would have been easy for the adults to take over and do everything themselves, but then the students wouldn't have learnt, and we wouldn't have seen what they were capable of.

Unfortunately the school environment is one where students are often told what they can't do. They can't do Maths, or they can't spell, or they can't run fast or throw a ball far. Quite often students (and sometimes parents) fall into the comparison trap, where we compare ourselves or our children to others and get disappointed when they aren't as good. But of course there will always be somebody better at something than ourselves. Comparing ourselves or our children with others will only lead to sadness.

On the other hand, focusing on what our children are good at can lead to great happiness. And what they are good at may surprise us greatly. Often we try to push our children into particular sports, with the hope they may become a superstar, only to find that their passion and talents lie somewhere else completely.

My second reflection was around what people can achieve in the right environment. Throughout the day there were about four or five people who started off thinking they were going to run a certain distance, only to run much further than they anticipated. Sometimes this was accidental (the support vehicle wasn't in the place everyone thought it was going to be!) and sometimes it was because they were feeling good and felt they would keep on going for a bit longer. But the reason they could go for longer was because of the environment they were running in. It was clear that it wasn't a race and everyone was supporting each other to run the next part.

In our Star of the Sea Catholic community it is important that we continue to work on creating the right environment where our children can flourish. And in flourishing we

shouldn't look to compare with others, but we should let the children find their own passions and talents, so that instead of becoming the people *we* want them to be, they can become the people *God* calls them to be.

# Sacrament Program

Star of the Sea will be offering a Sacrament Program in conjunction with the local parish for students who are interested. The seven sacraments of the Church include three sacraments of initiation, Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist, two sacraments of healing Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick and two sacraments of service and mission, Marriage and Holy Orders.

Students who are interested in learning more about their own faith journey and the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and First Communion (Eucharist), including Reconciliation are welcome to pass on their name to Mrs Davis or Mrs Robotham. Whilst a person can be baptised at any age (providing they have not previously been baptised), the sacraments of Confirmation, Reconciliation and First Communion are usually received in the upper primary years, or at a later age. The program will commence in Term One, 2024.









#### Tasmanian Science Talent Search



As we start to prepare for next year we are holding transition days for new students to the College. **Kinder** - we have already started our Little Stars program which Mrs Taylor is running every Wednesday afternoon.

**Year 7** - there will be a part-day transition on Thursday 16th November, and a full-day transition on Thursday 30th November. Smaller groups of students may also participate in extra transition times. **Primary school** - at this stage we are looking to have a Transition morning, where students in Primary move into their classes for next year with their teacher, on Monday 11th December. #### 2024 Uniform

Earlier this year we formed a Uniform Committee and consulted (through surveys) with staff, students and families. One of the things we consulted about was whether students in Primary should have PE uniform as their only uniform for year levels higher than Kinder. We also consulted about other options for the girl's uniform.

After receiving feedback and further discussions with the Uniform Committee, I would like to inform families that:

#### From 2024 onwards, students in Prep will have PE uniform as their only uniform.

This means that 2024 Prep families will not have to buy an academic uniform for their children.

The feedback regarding the girls uniform was not as clear and we will continue to look at options for this as we move into 2024. However, at this stage, there will be no change for the girls uniform for 2024.
