From the Principal

Each week I share with the staff a *Policy of the Week.* What that basically means is that I choose a policy that the school abides by and offer it to the staff to read and ask questions about. It is a good chance for me to refresh myself with policies as well. Like most people, I read policies once and then only bring them out again when a certain situation arises. None of these policies are secret - they are all available on the Catholic Education Tasmania website (https://catholic.tas.edu.au/policies) as they are applicable to all Catholic schools in Tasmania.

Last week I shared the *Enrolment Policy*. It is not a policy I refer to regularly at Star of the Sea, as it more applies to city schools that are bursting at the seams and need a process to go through to decide which children should take priority around enrolment time. At this stage there are not enough children in George Town for any school to be bursting at the seams! (Although when our current Grade 5's hit Year 7, we may have to refer to the policy...)

With all this in mind, it was good to read it with fresh eyes, and I was drawn to one particular point in the policy - The preferential option for the underprivileged, disadvantaged, and marginalised is fundamental in Catholic Schools. Catholic Schools have a responsibility to positively discriminate in favour of those who are in any way marginalised.

It is something which people outside of Catholic schools often aren't aware of. Unfortunately some Catholic schools have a reputation of being quite prestigious and uppity, only a ccepting enrolments from a certain *type* of family. People sometimes describe Catholic schools as private schools, as if only a privileged few can enrol in them.

But that's not what most Catholic schools are all about, and certainly not Star of the Sea. If we go by the wording of the policy, Catholic schools should be welcome to all, but especially those who are marginalised in some way. We need to be prepared to take this to the point that, if there were two people enrolling and there was only one spot available, and if one family were wealthy and stable and the second family couldn't afford fees or uniform and one of the parents was in jail, then we offer the spot to the second family and support them with paying fees.

This may go against some people's perception of a Catholic school and what we're about, and, fortunately, I have never been put in the position where I have had to decide between enrolling one student or another. Instead, I have been able to welcome all families who would like their child to be educated at a Catholic school.

All of this helps us to reflect upon what Catholic schools hope to achieve. We would prefer that our children don't grow up in a society full of inequity, where their trajectory in life is decided by whether their parents were able to pay for an education or not. We would like

everyone to have a good chance in life, and getting a sound education is one way that this can happen. To be part of the Star of the Sea Catholic community means being a part of a community where all are welcome, regardless of background. In this way, we hope to embrace the future as people of hope.



Medication at school Parent responsibilities



Complete and submit the Authorisation for Administration of Medication form annually or whenever medication requirements change.



Ensure medication is supplied ready to administer in the exact form and dosage required, as staff must not modify medication. (e.g. cutting tablets).



Supply medication that is in-date and provided in a pharmacylabelled container or a pharmacy-prepared Webster-pak



Medication should never be sent in unlabelled bags, food containers, lunch boxes, or any other unsuitable packaging.



Advise the school promptly of any changes to their child's medication, medical condition, or treatment plan.



For self-administration, provide written permission from a medical practitioner, dentist, pharmacist, authorised nurse practitioner or optometrist using the Authorisation for the Administration of Medication form
