From the Principal

If you are ever in North Sydney you could go to the burial place of St Mary MacKillop, Australia's only recognized saint. Her feast day is next Friday, August 8th. Buried in the Mary MacKillop Memorial Chapel, her tomb is visited by thousands every year. On the tomb is written one of her quotes - "We are but travellers here."

In this Jubilee Year, with the theme of Pilgrims of Hope, it is a good quote for us to reflect upon because it brings up two things. Firstly, that we are all on a journey. And secondly, that we are not here forever.

One of the things that we don't appreciate until we get a bit older is the journey that our lives take. Like the pilgrims of old who took long and arduous journeys in the hope of reaching a spiritual place, and being changed along the way, we too take a pilgrimage through life. We travel through life having new experiences, whether we seek them or not, and are changed along the way. For many of us the journey takes us to the experience of having children and we go through the ups and downs of parenthood. For others our journey takes us to looking after elderly parents. For others still the journey takes us to different places and different jobs. All of these experiences bring about change in us as we reflect upon the world around us and who we are as human beings.

And just like the pilgrims of old, we also undertake spiritual growth. Our understanding of God and who God calls us to be changes throughout our lives. For many of us we realise the importance of service to others and of reaching out beyond ourselves. Our lives become focused on something greater than ourselves.

But we are not here forever. As much as we work hard to earn money and buy stuff, none of it goes with us when we die. St Mary MacKillop's quote reminds us not to set our minds on worldly things too much as that leads us to focus on ourselves. Instead we are invited to focus on the needs of others and in doing so leave something which lasts long after we have gone. Our staff do this every day in their work with students, the impact of which will be felt long after they have left Star of the Sea.

Venerable Nano Nagle, the founder of the Presentation Sisters, had a similar outlook on life. She had enough money and enough rich relatives to be able to live a very comfortable life. Instead, she used it all to set up schools for the poor. She figured that this would be a better way to spend her life than collecting material wealth.

In our Star of the Sea Catholic community we journey together, we are pilgrims of hope. The very nature of us all being connected to the same school means that this journey that we undertake in life is shared with others. May this journey help us to come closer to the people God calls us to be.


Psalm for 18th Sunday in ordinary Time
