From the Principal

SBS has recently aired a program called *The Idea of Australia*, which basically looks at the stories we tell ourselves about the country we live in, and asks if they are really true. Many of us grew up with the idea of Australia being a place of the battler, of the pioneer, of the fair go, of Captain Cook and the ANZACS.

I remember having to do an assignment in secondary school where the topic was around who discovered Australia. We had done some lead-up work on this topic before having to write the essay, and we had heard about Captain Cook and some of the Dutch explorers who had come before him and mapped part of the country. But thinking back, I don't think at any time we discussed the idea that perhaps the Australian Aboriginals were here about 65,000 years earlier!

Fast forward about 35 years and at least we are now at the stage where most school students can recognise this. But when it comes to what we think the history of Australia is, especially after 1788, it often depends on who is telling the story.

Because the story will be different according to the narrator. Aboriginal Australians will most likely tell a story of being dispossessed, and of racist government policies which removed children from their families. Australians of British heritage might tell a story of pioneers and people "opening up the land." Australians of Italian heritage might tell a story of arriving in Australia after World War II and overcoming hardships, while Australians of Vietnamese heritage might tell a similar story, just set about 25 years later.

The point is, when it comes to history, all voices need to be heard, because all of these different groups contribute to what Australia currently is. The idea of bushrangers and the gold rush probably doesn't resonate with Australians of Vietnamese heritage, just as the story of Australians of Italian heritage probably doesn't resonate with Aboriginal Australians. But whether it resonates or not, we need to be prepared to be open and to listen, because all of these stories tell us who we are.

I write this reflection after returning from Melbourne where anti-immigration rallies were taking place. These seem to pop up every few years, but when we look deeper into them, they are usually led by people whose minds are closed to the idea that there might be different ideas about what Australia is to their own. The leaders of these rallies seem to lack empathy - the ability to see things from another's point of view. They seem to think that their idea of Australia is the *right one*, *and nothing else matters*.

The leaders of these rallies seem to want to put out a persona of being really tough, wearing all black and putting on masks. However, it would seem they are not tough enough to work in our nursing homes or hospitals or in hospitality or any other industry where there is a skills shortage which migrants fill.

In our Star of the Sea Catholic community we want our students to be welcoming, and to do

so they need to recognise that people will have different viewpoints to them - often not wrong or right, just different. By continuing to be open to these different ideas of who we are, we get closer to the one idea of who God calls us to be.

Psalm for the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time


The Lord hears the cry of the poor.
