From the Principal

In Celtic spirituality, there are such things as *thin times* and *thin places*. It goes with the belief that there is a veil that separates the earthly and the divine, and there are certain times and places where this veil is so thin that it is possible for a human to experience the divine.

For the Irish, one of these *thin times* was at the beginning of the northern hemisphere's winter - November 1st. At this time it was thought that the veil was so thin between the living and the dead that spirits would roam the earth, so bonfires were lit to keep them away. As Catholicism took hold in Ireland, this belief was merged with the Catholic celebration of All Hallows (All Saints) Day on November 1st and All Souls Day on November 2nd. It was thought that on the night before All Hallows Day (Hallow's evening, or Hallowe'en) was the time for spirits.

Of course, like a lot of things, Halloween has become commercialized and it is now a good opportunity for shops to make money selling lollies and pumpkins and for kids to dress up in their scary costumes.

Mexico has a similar celebration, called *the Day of the Dead*, around the same time of year, and in the Disney movie, *Coco*, it is around this time where the main character ends up in the spirit world. It is there that he learns the importance of remembering the dead. So how important is it for us to remember those who have died?

In the Catholic tradition, the Church is a community of both the living and the dead - we are all one, but perhaps just living on opposite sides of the veil. Every week in church we pray for those who have died that they will enter into heaven. We do it as an act of love to those who have died.

Even if it is not through prayer, remembering those who have gone before us is a way of celebrating their lives and keeping their memory alive, along with giving us a chance to think about our own mortality. We are not here forever, and realizing that helps us to live our lives wisely and lovingly.

This weekend gives us a chance to remember all of those who have died - those who we loved, those who we miss. It gives us a chance to honor their lives as well as thinking about how well we are using our own lives. So while the kids eat their chocolate in their costumes, maybe we as adults can pause to remember those whose lives have had a big impact on our own.
